1. Introduction

Parkside School (the School) is committed to providing the best possible care and education to its pupils and to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children and young people.

2. Scope of this Privacy Notice

This Recruitment Privacy Notice is intended as a notice provided to all job applicants for staff roles: academic and support, contractors, peripatetic, casual workers, temporary staff and volunteers who may be employed or engaged by the School to work for it in any capacity. It also applies to all governors.

In the course of the application process, the School will collect, use and hold ("process") personal data relating to you. This makes the School a data controller of your personal information, and this Privacy Notice sets out how it will use that information and what your rights are.

This Privacy Notice is not aimed at pupils, or parents of pupils (whether current, past or prospective) or other members of the public, nor does it inform staff how to handle the personal data of the same. This information may be found in the School's Privacy Notice, which provides further details about how personal data will be used by the School.

3. Aims

To ensure that the School is compliant with GDPR and all related Data Protection legislation pertaining to GDPR.
To ensure all data related to the School is kept secure and managed in accordance with the requirements of GDPR.

RECRUITMENT PRIVACY NOTICE – PARKSIDE SCHOOL



Data Protection Privacy Notice (Recruitment)

This notice explains what personal data (information) we will hold about you, how we collect it, and how we will use and may share information about you during the application process. It applies to all individuals applying for a position at the School, including positions as a member of staff (full time or part time), contractors, workers, governors, volunteers and peripatetic staff. It also applies to individuals we will contact in order to find out more about our job applicants, including referees, or those that are provided by job applicants as an emergency contact. We are required to notify you of this information under data protection legislation. Please ensure that you read this notice (sometimes referred to as a 'privacy notice') and any other similar notice we may provide to you from time to time when we collect or process personal information about you.

Who collects the information?

Parkside School ('the School') is a 'controller' and gathers and uses certain information about you. The School's contact details are as follows:

Data protection principles

We will comply with the data protection principles when gathering and using personal information, as set out in our *Data Protection Policy* (see School website: www.parkside-school.co.uk).

About the information we collect and hold

The table in 0 of the Schedule below summarises the information we collect and hold up to and including the shortlisting stage of the recruitment process, how and why we do so, how we use it and with whom it may be shared. The table in 0 of the Schedule below summarises the additional information we collect before making a final decision to recruit, i.e. before making an offer of employment unconditional, how and why we do so, how we use it and with whom it may be shared.

We seek to ensure that our information collection and processing is always proportionate and necessary for specific legitimate purposes. We will notify you of any changes to information we collect or to the purposes for which we collect and process it.

Where information may be held

Information may be held on school premises in our filing systems and on our servers. It may also be held by third party agencies, service providers and representatives.

How long we keep your information

We keep the personal information that we obtain about you during the recruitment process for no longer than is necessary for the purposes for which it is processed. How long we keep your information will depend on whether your application, or the application you are supporting (e.g. as a referee) is successful and you (the job applicant) become employed by us, the nature of the information concerned and the purposes for which it is processed.

We will keep recruitment information (including interview notes) for no longer than is reasonable, taking into account the limitation periods for potential claims such as race or sex discrimination (as extended to take account of early conciliation), after which they will be destroyed. This is likely to be for six months from the communication of the outcome of the recruitment exercise which takes account of both the time limit to bring claims and for claims to be received by the School. If there is a clear business reason for keeping recruitment records for longer than the recruitment period, we may do so but will first consider whether the records can be pseudonymised, and the longer period for which they will be kept.

If you are an applicant and your application is successful, we will keep only the recruitment information that is necessary in relation to your employment. For further information, see our *Privacy Notice for Staff and Governors*. Further details on our approach to information retention and destruction are available in our *Storage and Retention of Records Policy*.

Your Data rights to correct and access your information and to ask for it to be erased

Please contact our Privacy Officer, who can be contacted via the School Office (as detailed above) if you would like to correct or request access to information that we hold relating to you or if you have any questions about this notice. You also have the right to ask for information we hold and process to be erased ('the right to be forgotten') or not used in certain circumstances. The Privacy Officer will provide you with further information about your data rights, if you ask for it.

Keeping your personal information secure

We have appropriate security measures in place to prevent personal information from being accidentally lost, or used or accessed in an unauthorised way. This includes personal information being locked away, password protected or encrypted. We limit access to your personal information to those who have a genuine business need to know it. Those processing your information will do so only in an authorised manner and are subject to a duty of confidentiality. We also have procedures in place to deal with any suspected personal data breach (see our *Data Breach Management Policy*). We will notify you and any applicable regulator of a suspected data security breach where we are legally required to do so.
